Registration Process

- Parents/Guardians should apply using the application available on our website: baldwincountyschoolsga.org/baldwin-online-academy.
- 2. Once you've completed the application, you'll receive an email requesting that you schedule your **initial interview** where an acceptance decision will be made.
- 3. Once accepted, go to the appropriate Baldwin County school and speak with the registrar:
 - **K-5th grade** students to Central Office and speak with **Tori Dominy**.
 - **6th-8th grade** students to Oak Hill Middle and speak with **Michelle Rhodes**.
 - **9th-12th grade** students to Baldwin High and speak with **Terri Davis**.
- 4. The registrar will help you pick any needed classes and electives from our course list which can be found on our website.
- 5. Once the registrar has your schedule created in Infinite Campus, you will get an email from **Dawson Roberts** with your username and password to log into the Edgenuity platform and begin classwork.
 - The **login** button can be found on our website as well.

Enrollment Periods

Students and families who are new to Baldwin County School District may enroll at any time.

Current BCSD students who are interested in transferring to BOA:

All transfers into the program for students currently enrolled in a Baldwin County Public School District school, must initiate the transfer before the end of the first week of each semester. Students will not be allowed to transfer into the program after this deadline without explicit admin approval.

Course Requirements: High School

General Graduation Requirements Students entering the 9th grade for the first time in the 11-12 school year and all subsequent school years must meet all of the graduation requirements set forth in the Georgia State Board of Education amendments to Rule 160-3-1-.07 and Rule 160-4-2-.13 as well as in the additional Baldwin County Board of Education requirements. Students must be enrolled in grades 9-12 for a minimum of four years. Specifics on the required Units can be found on the Baldwin County High School website at **baldwincountyschoolsga.org/baldwin-high**.

Parents are strongly encouraged to make an appointment with their child's counselor to discuss these details. All students will be required to complete a total of 23 units for graduation.

All students will take: 4 units of English 4 units of Science 4 units of Mathematics

3 units of Social Studies

At least 3 units required from: Foreign Language* and/or CTAE and/or Fine Arts for all students

At least 4 additional electives

1 health/physical education course

*Students planning to enter or transfer into a University System of Georgia institution must take two units of the same foreign language.

Students are also required to complete several Milestone end-of-course exams for the courses listed below:

Grade Reporting

For **elementary and middle school students**, grades will be recorded upon the completion of each course section. A-Section courses will be recorded in December, and B-Section courses will be recorded in May. If a course has a milestone exam, the score for that test will count for 10% of the overall course grade.

It is a state requirement that all 3rd grade students pass the Reading Milestone and all 5th grade students must pass the Reading and Math Milestones in order to be promoted to the next grade level. Students who do not meet this requirement may only advance to the next grade via administrative decision.



Grade Reporting

For **high school students**, A-Section course grades will be recorded at the end of the first 9 weeks of the semester, and B-Section grades will be recorded after the second 9 weeks at the end of the semester. If a course has a milestone exam, the score for that test will count for 20% of the overall course grade.

Attendance Policy

Attendance at BOA is determined by activity time in online courses and will be checked at the end of each four and a half week period.

For each attendance period, students are expected to clock a minimum of 90 hours of activity total. One day of absence will be marked for every 8 hours off target. Students with more than 5 marked absences will be removed from the program.

If a student has completed all due assignments by each check date, and is passing all classes with at least a 70, the student will be counted fully present.

Continuation Policy

To ensure that all BOA students are successful with the program, grades and course progress percentages will be checked periodically by BOA staff throughout the school year.

Parents of students who are either failing or critically behind in two or more courses will receive email notification. If satisfactory progress is not met by the next check-up date, students will be asked to return to a traditional academic setting.

High school seniors are required to pass and stay up to date all courses to ensure graduation requirements will be met.

IV. Placement and Promotion in Grades Kindergarten Through Eight

A.

1. Kindergarten- Grade 1, and Grade 2

To be promoted, students must meet 70% of the standards in each subject area of the following areas: reading/ELA, math, social studies, science, with the exception of one subject area.

- 2. In grades three (3) through eight (8) students can fail no more than one (1) academic subject (reading, language arts, math, science, social studies) and be promoted to the next higher grade.
 - a. Students may not be retained in grades K-5 more than two (2) times unless such retention is required by state law or G.B.O.E. Rule.
- 3. In grade eight (8) students cannot fail 2 non-core subjects.

V. Placement or Promotion of Students in Grades Nine (9) Through Twelve (12)

- **A.** Promotion and graduation of students in Baldwin High School shall be based upon the number of units of credit as specified through state and local policy.
- **B.** Unit credit may be earned during 9-12 summer school ONLY when the summer school program is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) or the Georgia Accreditation Commission.
- **C.** Participation in a 1-12 summer school shall be an extension of the previous academic year and shall not count toward full-time attendance during the following academic year.
- **D.** A student shall be enrolled in four courses per semester unless:
 - 1. The student is enrolled in a dual or joint enrollment program with a Georgia public college, university or technical school; or
 - 2. The student is in his/her fifth year of high school.

Grade Level Classification

Students acquire grade level status based on the number of units earned.

Promotion/Retention Policy



GRADES K-8

- "Passing" a class requires a minimum final grade of 70% or higher.
- Students who fail a core course may be promoted pending Milestone assessments or administrative review.
- Students who fail 2 core courses will need to complete a summer learning opportunity to be considered for promotion. These opportunities will be determined by the home school.
- Students who fail 3 or more core courses will not be promoted to the next grade level.
- Students who fail all 4 core courses will be removed from the program and will not be promoted to the next grade level..

GRADES 9-12

- "Passing" a class requires a minimum final grade of 70% or higher.
- Students who fail a class with a final average between 62-69 may complete an appropriately rigorous summer learning activity to recover the credit. This can only be done for **ONE** class per semester.
- Students who fail 2 or more of their classes in a semester will be removed from the program.

 SENIORS will be removed from the program pending administrative decision is **ONE** class is failed.



Learning Coaches

As a participant in the Baldwin Online Academy program, it is critically important that a responsible adult, or "learning coach", monitors student progress and activity daily.

Learning coaches will be given observer accounts that will allow full access to student grades, activity, assignments, and teacher feedback.

We ask that learning coaches check student activity daily to ensure that students do not fall behind or begin to accrue absences.

Our program offers an online support service that assists parents/guardians in becoming more familiar with the Edgenuity platform. Learning coaches are highly recommended to take advantage of this resource. It can be accessed through the Edgenuity platform.
