Parents have the Right to ...

Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers and requires the school to give you this information in a timely manner.

To know if their child has been assigned, or has been taught for at least four consecutive weeks, by a teacher who does not meet the highly qualified definition.

To be involved in planning, writing policies/plans, and the implementation of the parent involvement program at the district and school level.
